The Mad River School District's administration takes a team approach when making decisions about school delays and closures. That decision is based on safety first, using the best information available at the time the decision must be made.



Input from the District's Transportation Department is received after we have driven various roadways in the school district firsthand. This procedure normally begins at 4:30 a.m. so that a decision can be made if a delay or cancellation seems warranted. The Superintendent may also consult with other area school districts. The final decision is generally reached around 6:00 a.m. to inform media and affected District personnel.

As a reminder, updates will also be posted on our mobile app, social media pages, and local news broadcasts. Please make sure your phone numbers are up-to-date at your child's school so that OneCall Now will notify you of a delay or cancellation.

School delays or cancellations due to dangerously cold weather will be based on the current weather forecasts which take into consideration temperatures and wind chill factors. As a guide, if the wind chill is minus 10 degrees or colder, a delay may be scheduled. If the forecast calls for brutal temperatures not to significantly improve, then Mad River would likely cancel classes for the day. The concern is about potential hypothermia, and skin exposure for the children who walk or wait at bus stops. Acknowledging the challenges we may face this winter due to the inclement weather, we will continue to work together to ensure all precautions are taken to keep our students safe. As always, students should dress warmly for the commute to and from school.

Makeup-Days

Ohio law requires schools to be in session a specific number of *hours*. Previously, the requirement called for a specific number of *days*, and Ohio law allowed up to only five calamity days before schools had to initiate make-up days. Mad River builds in more than the minimum number of required hours into each year's school calendar, so the District has a substantial built-in reserve to accommodate multiple delays or closures this school year, if needed.

As a reminder, parents are urged not to schedule vacation immediately following the days after school lets out for summer break. Should any Mad River school fall below the required minimum hours due to unscheduled school closings or delays, additional hours/days will be added on to the end of the school year.

Scheduled activities will be canceled when the District is closed due to inclement weather. Cancellations will be made with as much warning as possible. Weather closings on Fridays may cause weekend cancellations.

Activities: Even if school is closed, some after-school or evening activities may be held as planned. That's because conditions that were bad in the morning may be much better by the afternoon or evening. So closing school does not automatically mean all after-school and evening activities are also canceled. It is handled on a case-by-case basis.

Other districts: Mad River is in touch with other school districts, primarily to get a report on conditions there and what might be expected in our District. However, Mad River does not base decisions on what other districts do. Road condi-





STEM in Mad River

Mad River Schools are proud to offer a strong STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and

Math) education for all of our students. From preschool to high school our students are engaged in hands-on science, technology, engineering, and math. Whether it is a stream study for preschoolers or a launching homemade rockets in middle school, Mad River Schools believes in its vision to improve teaching and learning through STEM education. Most importantly, we are confident that we are providing high levels of engagement and an array of learning opportunities for our students to devel-



op critical problem-solving skills and prepare them to succeed in a global marketplace. We utilize the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force to participate in projects that develop an understanding of the science and mathematics of flight beginning with the study of mechanics developed in the Wright Brothers' Bicycle Shop. Students in fifth and sixth grades have an opportunity to participate in a STEM focused STARBASE program by having a variety of inquiry based learning experiences designed to increase interest and knowledge of math, science, and technology. Mad River Middle School implemented our newest STEM based class, Project Lead the Way (PLTW which gave students the opportunity to explore engineering).




CCP Modality

CCP Grades Distributed





Military Families

Currently, 16% of children with parents who are connected to the military attend schools in Mad River. Led by the efforts of school counselors, our District works diligently to support military families and address their unique educational challenges. Children whose parents serve in the military endure high rates of mobility and the effects of multiple



deployments. With frequent moves, children experience challenges associated with losing friends, teachers, and the comfort of a familiar environment. Our military impacted schools are committed to supporting military children in order to address these challenges and promote the resiliency necessary to cope with military life.

A deployment group for students has been formed to help children focus on specific issues, including those related to deployments, and dealing with the life of a military child. The District partners with the Wright-Patt's School Liaison Officers (SLO) to assist in sharing resources and programs available in the area to support educational opportunities to military families and students in order to achieve academic success. We work together to maximize the academic, artistic, athletic, and social skills of our military students and to assist families with questions and/or issues as they arise in transition, deployment, and relocation.

Purple**STAR**AWARD

During the 2017-2018 school year, Beverly Gardens Elementary was recognized by the Ohio Department of Education as a Purple Star School.

BG was one of eight Ohio schools to receive the Purple Star Award for their commitment to serving militaryconnected students and families.

The Purple Star Award for military friendly schools recognizes schools that show a

major commitment to serving students and families connected to our nation's armed forces.



Safe Schools Healthy Students

The Mad River School District is dedicated to maintaining a safe and healthy learning environment for our students, staff and community. The District has a comprehensive safety plan and policies to promote health and wellness. The district's goal is to promote and protect the health and wellness of every student. This commitment is reflected in its school nurse offices, health and physical education curricula, its adherence to state and federal health regulations and guidelines and comprehensive wellness policy.

Our schools use a variety of safety and security measures, such as periodic fire drills and evacuation of buildings, electronic alarms and secured locks, and camera surveillance in buildings and on buses. Our school facilities are routinely inspected by fire department personnel and building safety inspectors.

Bullying Prevention

The School Board is committed to providing an educational setting that is safe, secure, and free from harassment and bullying for all of its students and school employees. The District will not tolerate unlawful bullying and harassment of any type. An online reporting system has been created to appropriately identify, report, investigate, and respond to situations of bullying and harassment.

Safe Routes to School

In 2011, the City of Riverside, in collaboration with the Mad River Local School District, received a federal Safe Routes to School grant. ODOT's Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program has re-enforced the commitment of the Task Force and Stake Holder Members to identify and improve safe, walkable routes for all students. The Task Force is comprised of a creative, diverse, and motivated team seeking to make further improvements to the health, livelihood, and safety of every student attending our schools. These efforts will aid with providing safe routes to school for all students of Mad River.

PBIS

Behavior is an important and valuable component of the education process. *Positive Behavioral Intervention and Support (PBIS)* is a nationally recognized framework for shifting school culture from punitive to culturally responsive and positively reinforcing. Students and staff work to collaborate in targeted school-wide positive behavioral expectations which are positively reinforced throughout the school day. Nationwide data on schools implementing PBIS indicate an average of 50% reduction in disciplinary events.

ARMED RESPONSE TEAM FASTER



In 2016, the Mad River Board of Education voted to have armed security response teams in our schools. These teams consist of employees who had to pass an interview process and training program in order to be approved as one of the team. Team members have been trained through the FASTER Saves Lives training. The training is hands-on and participants have to qualify just as an Ohio peace officer would. The response team will train with local law enforcement twice a year as well as using a shooting range for target practice.

The response team will be able to access the firearms, which are locked in security boxes and placed in various areas throughout our eight school buildings. Members of the response team will only access the firearms in the event of a true emergency such as an active shooter situation.

While the District hopes to never have to access the guns, we want to be prepared in case something should happen.
