Community

A residential suburb of Dayton, Ohio with a population of approximately 30,000; the community is a mixture of suburban, rural and military families. Riverside is a family-oriented community that sits directly next to Wright Patterson Air Force Base. Stebbins High School is located within the Mad River School District and has high expectations of its educators and provides excellent educational opportunities for all students. The socioeconomic status allows for 100% of Stebbins students to receive free breakfast and lunch. Stebbins' student body is culturally diverse with a population that is 68% White, 12% Black, 11% 2 or more races, 5% Latino, and 4% Asian.

School

Stebbins High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school and career technical center that approximately 1,100 students attend in grades 9-12. Accredited by the Ohio Department of Education Association, Stebbins was selected in the first year of competition (1977) as one of the finalists for the Blue Ribbon School of Excellence. Additionally, Stebbins offers college preparatory, career-technical and special education programs; The staff includes 80 teachers, 4 counselors, 1 head principal, 1 assistant principals, 1 dean of students and a career technical principal. Stebbins is a STEM designated high school in a Purple Star School District.

Curriculum

The academic program is organized on an 8th Bell schedule. Juniors and Seniors can specialize in one of the ten career tech programs offered by the school. Twenty-one credits are required for a high school diploma. Noted on the transcript; Students must also obtain a competency score of 684 in Algebra 1 and English Language Arts 2 in order to graduate or seek an alternative pathway through 2 career focused activities or military enlistment. Additionally, students must earn a state seal and additional state seal or local seal to fulfill graduation requirements.
